- The EMS personnel are based and licensed in one state and are the first due responders or mutual aid providers under local governmental or interagency agreement/contract to an area of an adjacent state
- The EMS personnel originate in the state in which the EMS personnel are licensed and respond into another upon being dispatched to a major incident (e.g., multicasualty scene), provide care and may transport within the incident state or to other states
- The EMS personnel originate in the state in which the EMS personnel are licensed and respond into another upon being dispatched to a gubernatorially declared disaster, provide care, and may transport within the incident state or to other states
- The EMS personnel are based and licensed in one state and as part of their federal *employment* capacity have been deployed to another state and provide care, regardless of patient origin and destination

 The EMS personnel are based and licensed in one state and as part of their federal contractor capacity have been deployed to another state and provide care, regardless of patient origin and destination
