RESOLUTION 2026-03

Appreciation for the National Registry of EMTs

Recognition of the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians

WHEREAS, the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) is the national certifying body for emergency medical services professionals in the United States, advancing the EMS profession through psychometrically sound certification, applied research, and partnership with state EMS systems; and

WHEREAS, NREMT certification is the foundation upon which the Recognition of Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact rests, providing the uniform, legally defensible, nationally recognized standard of competence that makes interstate Privilege to Practice operationally and legally coherent; and

WHEREAS, NREMT provides the Commission's principal source of operating revenue through quarterly transfers, sustaining substantially all of the Commission's operations and enabling the Commission to fulfill its statutory and operational responsibilities to its member states; and


WHEREAS, NREMT further provides, at no cost to the Commission, the software application, technology infrastructure, hosting environment, and database administration services that operate the National EMS Coordinated Database, the system through which member states verify licensure status, exchange adverse action information, and maintain the Privilege to Practice; and

WHEREAS, this combined financial, technical, and in-kind contribution is exceptional in the landscape of interstate compacts and reflects a sustained institutional commitment by NREMT to the public protection mission the Commission was established to fulfill.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Interstate Commission for EMS Personnel Practice formally recognizes the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians as an indispensable partner in the operation of the United States EMS Compact and extends its appreciation for NREMT's financial, technical, and in-kind contributions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission invites continued collaboration with NREMT leadership and staff in its meetings, workgroups, and technical initiatives, and directs that a formal copy of this resolution be prepared and presented to the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians.
